Dear Friends.

The calendar and the weather forecast don't agree every day, but the consensus seems to be that Spring has indeed arrived. And what a season Spring can be for us; it offers daily opportunities to observe the miracle of new life and growth. Seasonal celebrations highlight those potentials and possibilities. They also, if we dig beneath the surface, acknowledge that with the new, there is always the need to confront that which has passed.

As I see daylily sprouts peeking up in my garden, I also see the dead stalks from last year which my interdependent self left out for insects and any other critters who might want them. UUFD Welcome Essentials Pantry

The Pantry is now well-established as a drive-thru pantry from 9:00 to 10:30 a.m. on the last Saturday of every month. For the past several years, we served an average of 30 to 65 households each time, and we welcomed new families and individuals every time we hosted a pantry. During our highest attendance month, we served more than 90 families. As inflation soars, we're providing even more bags — a record 115 on March 25, 2023.

Your donation enables us to provide toilet paper, paper towels, sponges, laundry soap, dryer sheets, trash bags, toothbrushes, and toothpaste. We offer these household essentials in a welcoming environment that affirms the inherent worth and dignity of every person.

All funds raised go directly to purchasing items to distribute at the pantry. All of our work is provided by volunteers, and the UU Fellowship donates space and office support as part of its outreach ministries.

The worship theme for April is Grief; for May the theme is Reconciliation.

The worship leaders will use these themes to guide their services throughout the month. We encourage you to take a look at the Touchstones Journal on our website at <u>uufdekalb.org/touchstones</u> (or pick up a copy at the table by the magazine rack) and hope it will lead to deeper discussions!

OUR MINISTRY IN ACTION THROUGH HOPE HAVEN MEALS

The Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of DeKalb, along with many other congregations around the DeKalb County area, provide meals once a month to the residents and visitors of Hope Haven. Hope Haven's mission is to provide shelter, meals, & life skills programs for homeless individuals & families while preparing them for re-housing. Hope Haven will advocate for the rights of the homeless, and those at risk for becoming homeless, while working in collaboration with others to end homelessness in DeKalb County.

Why is this ministry important to us? It is a direct reflection of our first UU principle, "The inherent worth and dignity of every person."

Reflection on the First Principle:

"Reverence and respect for human nature is at the core of Unitarian Universalist (UU) faith. We believe that all the dimensions of our being carry the potential to do good. We celebrate the gifts of being human: our intelligence and capacity for observation and reason, our senses and ability to appreciate beauty, our creativity, our feelings and emotions. We cherish our bodies as well as our souls. We can use our gifts to offer love, to work for justice, to heal injury, to create pleasure for ourselves and others.
