Notes from the Podium from Elisa Woodruff, UUCD Music Program Director

THANK YOU to everyone for showing such strong enthusiasm for the UUCD Music Program this past year. Your participation, feedback, and support has truly made our return to in person worship a lively and visceral experience. I just wanted to give four important updates regarding the next few months and how you can get involved in our efforts to express our spiritual journey, regardless of your experience or ability.....

- 1. Save the Date!! The afternoon of August 5th, from 1pm to 2:30pm, a few choir members and I will be conducting the first of two 90 minute "Church Music 101" workshops. If you are interested in learning some very basic elements of music notation that will make it easier for you to follow along with hymns or even feel more comfortable joining the choir or playing a solo, you do not want to miss this!! We will use a few familiar UU hymns as examples to learn the "roadmap" of music -- including how to follow verses, repeat signs, first/second endings, and the basics of meter and key signatures. Please email me at elisa.woodruff@gmail.com if you are interested in attending, so I know how many to expect. Please note that this initial workshop will be geared toward adults. Future music education will be available to children in the RE program at a different time/date.
- 2. I've heard many of you say you are interested in getting involved in the music program but may be having a hard time knowing where you would best fit. If you are interested in having a 30-minute Individual Music Strengths Assessment, please reach out to me individually. Please note that these are not auditions -- just opportunities to have a professional musician (me) listen to you sing or play your instrument, identify your vocal range, give you tips on how to build on your strengths, and help you determine how you might become involved in our program. In the past, I have done individual vocal coaching for upwards of \$100 per hour, so this is a great opportunity to get some professional, strengths-based feedback for free!!
- 3. Please save the date for Sunday August 13th when we will be hosting the Second Annual Music Program Picnic after coffee hour. Please join us at the gazebo as we come together joyfully to eat, play musical instruments, and learn a few fun songs to sing at church the following Sunday. All are welcome. More details coming soon!!
- 4. Finally, some thank yous and one last pitch. Our summer music calendar is off to a great start. Thank you to Ashley, Gretchen, Toni, Reverend Linda, Beth, Maggie, Gabriel, and Ariana for stepping up to provide special music this summer while Bonnie and the choir are on break.
